POLICE MADE TWO LIQUOR SEIZURES

Proprietors of Both Places Are Arraigned in Court on Complaints Charging Liquor Keeping

Police made two liquor raids on Saturday evening, finding a small amount of liquor in each place and arresting the alleged proprietors of each establishment for liquor keeping.

The raids were made at about the same time, when officers C. L. O'Malley, Mehlman, Moody, Flaherty, Lengendre and Burgess left the police station with two liquor warrants.

Officers O'Malley, Mehlman and Moody paid a visit to the residence of Robert E. Gillis at the rear of 383 Main street and when denied admittance, Gloucester Daily Times Monday, Aug. 31, 1931

found about a gallon of alcohol in 17 bottles. Gillis was arrested for liquor keeping yesterday.

Officers Flaherty, Lengendre and Burgess were visiting the home of Betty Sullivan at 12 Howe street, while the Gillis raid was going on, and here unearthed about a half-gallon of home brewed beer and a small amount of alcohol which the woman said she had to rub her leg with.

In the district court this morning both were arraigned on liquor keeping charges and their cases were put over Monday morning until September 9.

LOCAL SEINER AGAIN TO RESCUE

The Gloucester fishing schooner Nova Julia, which rescued and brought to port the survivors of the wreck of the Halifax-to-Boston passenger plane off Gloucester last Thursday, was engaged in rescue work again Saturday night when she attempted to haul another Gloucester schooner off the rocks at Monhegan, Me.

Swinging out to permit the mail steamer to enter the port, the Clarence B. Mitchell grounded on Smutty Nose, a small rocky island, and an

ebbing tide left her high and dry.

Capt. Leo Favoloro of the Nova Julia ordered a line made fast to the grounded vessel and tried unsuccessfully to tow her off her dangerous position. While the Mitchell listed more and more as the tide fell, a four-inch cable was rigged in such a way that it prevented her from falling, and her crew of 12 men sought refuge on other vessels in the harbor.

It was hoped that the Mitchell would float on the high tide at midnight.
